

Pace of Play Policy

In 1993, the United States Golf Association developed a formula, the USGA Pace Rating, that can help players to complete a round of golf at an optimum pace. The USGA Pace Rating calculates completion time ("Time Par") for each hole on your course, taking into account length and difficulty of the hole and other attributes of play. Time pars allow players to keep track of when they are expected to arrive at each tee. Seven Oaks Country Club has a pace rating of 4 hours 20 minutes. This is how long it should take to play 18 holes when our course is playing at capacity. Seven Oaks Country Club and the Men's Golf Committee have agreed that this form of tracking "Time Par" is the most equitable and that Members along with their guests are responsible for honoring this pace whenever they are using the golf course. There will be times that a group may fall behind due to a lost ball or other "uncontrollable" situation. Our Staff will make every effort to assist you in regaining your position on the course. This may include raking bunkers, forecaddeing, searching for a lost ball, etc. If the group is still not making progress toward closing the gap, they will be asked to pick up and move to the next tee. Please remember that your position on the golf course is immediately behind the group in front of you. The position of the group behind you is not your concern. They are not part of the Time Par equation. The Golf Professional and Staff shall interpret all rules governing slow play and shall be the final authority in the enforcement of these rules.

Nine changes in the new Rules of Golf you absolutely need to know for 2021

- I. Accidents happen New language, first adopted through Local Rules since 2017, states there is no penalty if you accidentally move your ball (or ball marker) on the green. Put the ball back and you're good to go. The same applies if you're searching for a lost ball and mistakenly move it.
- II. The fix is in—Golfers often complained about the silliness of letting players fix a ball mark on the green, but not a spike mark. What's the difference? With no good answer, officials now will let you fix everything without a penalty. You can also touch the line of your putt with your hand or club so long as you're not improving it.
- III. A lost cause—To improve pace of play, golfers now have just three minutes to search for a missing ball rather than five. Admit it, if you hadn't found it in three minutes, you weren't finding it anyway.
- IV. Knee is the new shoulder—The process for dropping a ball back in play is revamped in the new rules. Instead of letting go from shoulder height, players will drop from around their knee. This is a compromise from an original proposal that would have let golfers drop from just inches above the ground. To preserve some randomness with the drop, officials went with knee height instead. Why change at all? Primarily to speed up play by increasing the chances your ball stays within the two-club-length drop area on the first try.
- V. No longer a touchy subject—Hitting a ball into a water hazard (now defined as "penalty area") should come with consequences. But golfers don't have to be nervous about incurring an additional penalty for a minor rules breach while playing their next shot. You're free to touch/move loose impediments and ground your club, eliminating any unnecessary worry. The only caveat: You still can't put your club down and use it to improve the conditions for the stroke. You can remove loose impediments in bunkers, too, although touching the sand in a bunker in front of or behind the ball is still prohibited.
- VI. Damaged goods—We all get mad on the course, and sometimes that anger is taken out on an unsuspecting driver or putter. Previously, the rules were confusing on when or if you could play a club you damaged during a round, and it led to instances where some players were disqualified for playing clubs with a shaft slightly bent or some other damage they didn't realize the club had. Now you can play a club that has become damaged in any fashion. If you caused the damage, however, you can't replace the club with a new one.
- <u>VII. Twice is ...OK</u>— A double hit is almost always accidental, and the outcome so random as to hardly be beneficial. So golfers are now spared the ignominy of adding a penalty for hitting a ball twice with one swing. It counts as only one stroke. Somewhere T.C. Chen is smiling.
- <u>VIII. The end of flagstick folly.</u>—Another nod to common sense eliminates a penalty for hitting a flagstick left in the hole while putting on a green. Taking out and then placing back in flagsticks can often cause undue delay in the round, and the flagstick is as likely to keep your ball out of the cup as it would help it fall in.
- IX. O.B. option—Courses may implement a Local Rule (not for competition) that offers an alternative to the stroke-and-distance penalty for lost balls or shots hit out-of-bounds. A player may drop a ball anywhere between where the original ball was believed to come to rest (or went out-of-bounds) and just into the edge of the fairway, but no nearer the hole. The golfer takes a two-stroke penalty and plays on instead of returning to the tee. This way, the Local Rule mimics your score if you had played a decent provisional ball.

The Seven Oaks Top 10

Over the course of the season players will earn points for each Men's Golf Committee event they play in. Points will be awarded based on participation, the event played and what place they finish. At the end of the season, the Top 10 players who have accumulated the most points will be awarded prizes based on their finish. It is also important to know that players may also earn points by participating in the weekly SWATS game. Below you will find a scale on how points are awarded.

- The SWATS game is a weekly game conducted every Saturday & Sunday based on availability.
- Players will earn season long points towards The Seven Oaks Top 10 list for participation from 4/10/21 thru 9/5/21. You are able to obtain a maximum of 2 points per month playing SWATS.
- All players must call or notify the Golf Shop by 8:00 A.M. to sign up.
- All play will begin at 8:30 a.m. with tee times starting on Hole #1. No shotguns or Back 9 starts will take place unless the Golf Shop approves.
- All games will be based off 100% of the player's course handicap.
- Summer rules will be in effect unless the Golf Shop alters based on course conditions (i.e. winter rules or lift, clean and place).
- The Golf Shop to determine game.
- Both the Saturday & Sunday game entry fee is \$21 dollars (\$5 dollars to skin game, \$15 dollars to Team or Individual game and \$1 dollar to staff).
